## 2011 Summer Adventure Camp

The Country Childrens Center offers childcare in a summer camp setting for children ages 5 years old through 6th grade. We accept children entering 7th and 8th grade in our "Senior Camper" Group. The camp runs for 8 weeks in July and August with full summer or half summer options. We are located at the "White House" on Route 35 in Katonah. Our program is designed to provide children with all the experiences of a great summer day camp while providing working parents with coverage for their child-care needs. The camp is regulated by The Westchester County Department of Health.

### **OUR PROGRAM:**

The Summer Adventure Camp provides a wide range of activities including:

- General Sports (soccer, wiffle ball, basketball, sand volleyball, and camp Olympics)
- Adventure Games
- Arts and crafts
- Science and nature
- Music and dance
- Film making projects/ photography
- Field Trips
- Swimming (instructional & free swim)

CCC operates a Red Cross certified swimming program. Our Aquatics Director/ Water Safety Instructor supervises our pool. The pool is inspected and licensed by the Westchester County D.O.H. Our Aquatics Director assesses each camper's swimming ability during the first few days of camp. Swimming groups based on ability will be formed within each group. We include special events like survival swim, parent swim and water sports. Our philosophy is that each camper should be given an opportunity to feel comfortable in the water and progress at their own rate while becoming familiar with and practicing water safety in the pool area.

### **OUR STAFF:**

The Summer Adventure Camp has a dedicated staff whose main concerns are the safety, happiness and well being of each child. Staff members receive extensive training prior to the start of camp. The Camp is supervised by a Camp Director, Health Director, and Aquatics Director. Other staff includes, head and assistant activity leaders, a sports and games specialist, and an arts and crafts specialist.

**Camp Location:**

The White House is located on 4 acres of beautiful wooded property with an in-ground pool, sport court, playground, sand volleyball court, and 2 putting greens. These amenities allow the children to participate in a wide range of age and developmentally appropriate activities throughout the summer.

**Watson/ Kitchawan Drop Off and Pick-Up Site:**

For IBM Watson families, campers will be transported from our Kitchawan location to the White House at 8:30 A.M. and will return at 4:00 P.M. Upon returning to the facility, campers will have access to the game room and many indoor and outdoor activities. There is an additional fee for this transportation service.

**Registration Deadline:**

Completed registration forms along with a \$500 non-refundable deposit PER CHILD must be received by April 1, 2011. Registration is on a first come first serve basis. If you are placed on the waiting list, you will hear by April 15 if space becomes available. Balance will be due in 2 installments on May 1st and July 1st.





### **Summer Adventure Camp Groups:**

**Willows:** This is our entry level group. The Willows' home base is located in the upstairs front room of the White House. The Willows program is designed to ease the transition for children who may have been in half day care to a full day at school. On a daily basis the Willows will have swimming lessons, arts and crafts, and organized sports and games. Throughout the summer there will be three field trips, camp Olympics, a talent show, nature hikes, and a weekly awards ceremony.

**Elms:** The Elms have completed first grade and are entering second grade. The Elms' home base is the upstairs back room at the White House. Having completed a summer at camp, the Elms act as role models for the younger campers and will participate in more challenging activities. On a daily basis the Elms will have swimming lessons, arts and crafts, and organized sports and games. Throughout the summer there will be three field trips, camp Olympics, a talent show, nature hikes, and a weekly awards ceremony.

**Oaks:** The Oaks have completed second grade and are entering third grade. For the first time, your child's home base will be located in an outdoor tent. While they will be participating in arts and crafts indoors, the Oak experience remains largely an outdoor adventure. On a daily basis the Oaks will have swimming lessons, organized sports and games, and will be working on a film project to be shown at the end of camp. Throughout the summer there will be three field trips (including cliff climbing!), camp Olympics, a talent show, nature hikes, and a weekly awards ceremony.

**Aspens:** The Aspens are entering fourth grade and their home base is located in an outdoor tent. The bulk of the Aspens' activities take place outdoors. This year, the Aspens will be in charge of creating the camp yearbook. On a daily basis the Aspens will have swimming lessons, arts and crafts, and organized sports and games. Throughout the summer there will be three field trips, camp Olympics, a talent show, nature hikes, and a weekly awards ceremony.

**Sequoias:** The Sequoias are entering fifth and sixth grade. In addition to their regular scheduled activities, they will act as role models for the younger campers. They are also responsible for the camp carnival and will be creating and performing in a play. Their home base, "Camp Sequoia", is located at the top of the hill beyond the sports court. Throughout the summer there will be three field trips, camp Olympics, a talent show, nature hikes, and a weekly awards ceremony.

**Seniors:** The Senior campers are entering seventh and eighth grade and will be assigned to one of the younger groups. While they will spend lunch and arts and crafts together, they will be spending most of their time assisting the staff with the younger campers. Although they are still campers, the Senior Camper program is designed to give your child the experience of being a role model and mentor to the younger groups.
