On Thursday, December 27th we took at trip to The Wolf Conservation in Cross River. They had a special event called the "Holiday Howl." The Wolf Conservation staff gift rapped a box



full of food (raw meat, bones, and garbage) and it got demolished by two wolves. We were able to see a total of five different wolves, and were lucky enough



to catch a glimpse of a wolf so rare, in which only 300 exist in the entire world. This rare wolf is known as the Mexican Red Wolf.
