To honor the diversity at Bedford Hills, we had an annual international family pot luck dinner. It was such a special evening. Almost all of the families attended carrying dishes of plenty that stretched across the globe!

On a daily basis, I am grateful to watch the children accomplish simple things like trying foods from another part of the world. They don't recognize how the exposure is affecting them, but as an adult it's easy to see the beauty in their acceptance. Our Motto here at the CCC is "Little Steps....Big Feats". My hope is that these little footsteps that walk out of these CCC doors, enter the bigger world, and lead to deep footprints and more world peace which is indeed a "Big Feat"!

Since my return to the CCC, I realized that this theme did not need to be implemented in our center, but rather that it is omnipresent. Our small center alone has families from across the globe; Ecuador, Spain, France, Russia, Puerto Rico, England, Mexico, Japan, Guatemala, Poland, India, and Peru.
